
INDIGROW STRATEGIC ACTION PLAN 2023 - 2025





What is IndiGrow?

IndiGrow is Indigo Shire Council's economic advisory Committee. Through IndiGrow, local business leaders provide strategic advice to Council to drive sustainable economic growth.

IndiGrow comprises members of Council and Indigo's business community who meet quarterly to identify economic opportunities that improve the financial, social and environmental capacity of Indigo's businesses.

Purpose and Objectives

IndiGrow have set their own agenda in defining their objectives and priorities as a Committee. Six objectives help guide IndiGrow's decision making and prioritisation:

- Build a communications structure for a two-way dialogue between Council, Industry and other levels of Government
- Provide advice and expertise to support and inform Council's economic policy development and State and Federal Policy agendas
- Identify future and emerging strategic opportunities for priority allocation of resources
- Identify and recommend priority areas for grant funding support from various government and non-government sources
- Identify and recommend future budget priorities for Council
- Develop Industry through identifying critical gaps in skills and knowledge and prioritising developmental initiatives



IndiGrow Strategic Action Plan

In a series of workshops held during 2021 – 2022, the members of IndiGrow came together to set their objectives and to outline a series of actions aligned to key priority areas.

In order to achieve IndiGrow's promise of driving sustainable economic growth for local businesses, it was vital that the Committee were clear on what focus areas needed attention for development and advocacy, and what actions they could take as a Committee to drive positive outcomes.

The following actions have been designed to create meaningful outcomes and steps forward on five priorities for the Committee. The action plan covers 2023-2025, and will be reviewed in the last quarter of 2025.



Advocacy and Support Priorities

For each priority area the Committee identified, a series of important deliverables were outlined. The Committee then collaborated to develop an action plan to support each deliverable for the five advocacy and support priorities.

1. Planning

- 1.1 Inform policy development and review and inform Council policy and planning processes including place-based strategies
- 1.2 Understand the possibilities of what IndGrow can influence in terms of Council decision making regarding planning
- 1.3 Monitor and share concerns expressed by business regarding planning processes

2. Sustainability

- 2.1 Ensure IndiGrow is aware of economic opportunities for the shire as identified by the Environment Committee
- 2.2 Advise Council on trends/opportunities/challenges for business sustainability, including government initiatives for Indigo Shire

3. Business Collaboration

- 3.1 Identify ways to make Council engagement with the business sector less intimidating
- 3.2 Provide strategic, place based advice to Council regarding business collaboration
- 3.3 Encourage business sector to be part of the conversation re. Indigo Shire economic development

4. Workforce Development

- 4.1 Encourage "grow your own" approach to staffing challenges in Indigo Shire ie. build expertise of emerging workforce
- 4.2 Monitor policy changes/incentives at federal and state level that can influence Indigo and share with Council
- 4.3 Monitor and share innovative examples of solutions to staffing challenges for consideration by Indigo Shire businesses

5.1 Identify safety and business impacts of poor connectivity and feed up to Council to support advocacy for improved connectivity
